A Resolution Supporting Keith Harper as an Outstanding Nominee for **Ambassador**



Resolution No. 13-26



WHEREAS, Keith Harper is a citizen of the Cherokee Nation; and,



WHEREAS, Barack Obama, President of the United States, has nominated Keith Harper to be Representative of the United States to the United Nations Human Rights Council, with rank of Ambassador; and,



WHEREAS, Keith Harper is a legal scholar, professor and attorney who has worked tirelessly on behalf of Tribes and Native people for his entire career and Keith Harper has proven to be a champion for justice and Indian Country; and,



WHEREAS, Keith Harper navigated a long and complicated settlement in Cobell v Salazar and he will bring this unique perspective and experience to his work on behalf of human rights on a global scale; and,



WHEREAS, President Obama committed to appoint Natives to high positions within his administration and Keith Harper's nomination is a continuance of that promise: and,

WHEREAS, Keith Harper, if confirmed by the Senate, would be the first person from a federally recognized tribe to serve as a U.S. Ambassador; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes strongly supports Mr. Harper's nomination as U.S. Ambassador to the U.N. Human Rights Council.
