WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA), Section 10221 includes the Indian Health Care Improvement Act (IHCIA), and other important provisions specific to the American Indian population; and

WHEREAS, the IHCIA provides the primary legislative authority for the Indian health system, including those health services operated by IHS, Tribal and Urban Indian (I/T/U) providers. The IHCIA was permanently reauthorized in 2010: and

WHEREAS, the IHCIA is the cornerstone legislation which provides healthcare services for American Indians/Alaska Natives (AI/AN) in fulfillment of the federal government's trust responsibility; and

the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes (ITC) is an

organization that unites the tribal governments of the Cherokee, Chickasaw,

Choctaw, Muscogee (Creek), and Seminole Nations, representing more than

WHEREAS, the Indian-specific provisions are integral to the effective performance of the Indian health system and must be preserved. These provisions include:

> services provided notwithstanding any Federal, State, or local law to the contrary;

> Section 2901, which states that any I/T/U be the payer of last resort for

Section 2902, which grants I/T/U providers permanent authority to collect reimbursements for all Medicare Part B services:

Section 9021, which ensures that any health benefits provided by a Tribe to its members are not included as taxable income; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes hereby strongly urges congress to preserve the Indian Health Care Improvement Act and Section 2901, Section 2902, and Section 9021, that are currently included in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
