
# The INTER-TRIBAL COUNCIL of the FIVE CIVILIZED TRIBES

### A Resolution Regarding Title VI Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements

### Resolution No. 21-30



WHEREAS, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes (ITC) is an organization that unites the tribal governments of the Cherokee, Chickasaw, Choctaw, Muscogee (Creek) and Seminole Nation, representing approximately 815,000 Indian people throughout the United States; and



WHEREAS, the Department of the Treasury, among other U.S. Departments and agencies, have begun issuing packets for federal funding to eligible tribal governments that include a form entitled Title VI Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements; and



WHEREAS, the Department is imposing this form on tribes as a condition to receive current and future federal funding, which is a direct threat to tribal sovereignty; and



WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan, previous pandemic relief legislation, and Title VI of the Civil Rights Act does not require tribes to complete and submit such form as a condition to receive federal funding; and



WHEREAS, no tribal consultation was held by the Department, or the administration, on the inclusion of this form and its requirements.



WHEREAS, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act does not apply to Indian tribes and tribal governments; and



WHEREAS, tribes have their own laws and anti-discrimination regulations that are often more rigorous than Title VI of the Civil Rights Act and tribes should be able to certify compliance with their own non-discrimination laws, such as elder preference laws, which are often times more effective; and

WHEREAS, this is a direct infringement of tribal sovereignty and waives sovereign immunity that would have dire consequences to the government-togovernment relationship our sovereigns share.

NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes urges the U.S. Department of the Treasury to rescind the Title VI Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements form and not require tribes to complete and submit the form to receive statutorily allowed funding; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes urges the U.S. Department of the Treasury to allow tribes to self certify compliance of their own non-discrimination laws rather than compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
