A Resolution To Address Oklahoma Executive Order 2023-01, Addressing the Formation of the Child Welfare Task Force


Resolution No. 23-02



WHEREAS, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes (ITC) is an organization that unites the tribal governments of the Cherokee, Chickasaw, Choctaw, Muscogee, and Seminole Nations, representing approximately 815,000 Indian people throughout the United States; and



WHEREAS, the landmark Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978 (ICWA) was enacted to prevent the unnecessary breakup of Native families; and



WHEREAS, ICWA has been labeled "the gold standard" of child welfare policy by experts and national leading child advocacy organizations far beyond Indian Country; and



WHEREAS, sixty percent of Native Children in OKDHS custody belong to the Five Civilized Tribes; and



WHEREAS, a significant percentage of all children in Oklahoma child welfare custody are Indian children; and

WHEREAS, a majority Indian children in OKDHS custody are eligible through relationships with the Five Civilized Tribes; and



WHEREAS, the Pinnacle Plan was identified as pivotal to improving the state child welfare system and included tribal representation; and

WHEREAS, the State of Oklahoma and the Five Civilized Tribes have entered into intergovernmental ICWA agreements for the protection of our children and tribal input is imperative.



NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes strongly supports the Indian Child Welfare Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes believes ICWA, as a pillar of sovereignty, must be fiercely protected.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes supports all Native American children in Oklahoma as they seek to uphold ICWA.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes supports the addition of tribal voices on the Child Welfare Task Force, through tribal representation comprised of twenty-five percent of the twelve identified Task Force members as tribal representatives. As reflected by the percentages of Tribal children in custody, we request two members be identified from the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes and two representatives from the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare

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Association. One to be the president of the association and one to be designated by the general membership of that association, as designees on Governor Stitt's proposed Oklahoma Executive Order 2023-01.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the tribal voices on the Child Welfare Task Force shall be full members, in addition to the other members of the Task Force.
