

A Resolution In Support of the Preservation of the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Act


Resolution No. 23-08







WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Act was adopted in 1982 and holds a higher standard than the Federal Indian Child Welfare Act; and



WHEREAS, the Native American Caucus of the Oklahoma State Legislature to recognize, maintain, and preserve the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Act in its entirety; and



WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Act preserves the sovereignty of Indian Nations and culture for Indian children and future generations and maintains the bonds with Indian children and their families; and



WHEREAS, the Child Welfare Services Sub-Committee requests ITC support to maintain and preserve the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Act; and

WHEREAS, one-third of foster children in the state of Oklahoma are Indian children forty percent of Indian Children in Oklahoma foster care are members of the Five Civilized Tribes and approximately; and



NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes strongly supports the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Act.
